- (c) Compare and contrast the literary styles and themes of Chaucer with those of his contemporaries.
- (d) Critically analyze the major shifts in thoughts, art and society that characterized the transition from Middle Ages to Renaissance.
- (e) Assess the evolution of theatre in English literature.

(Poetry)

2. Answer any one of the following : 10

- (a) Show how *The Nun's Priest's Tale* fits into the larger context of *The Canterbury Tales* and its exploration of diverse perspectives and social commentary.
- (b) Evaluate *The Nun's Priest's Tale* as a mock epic poem.

- (c) Critically examine William Shakespeare as a sonneteer with reference to the sonnets prescribed in your syllabus.
- (d) "Metaphysical poetry inclines to the personal and intellectual complexity and concentration." Discuss how John Donne's *The Sunne Rising* portrays the metaphysical elements.
- (e) John Donne's *Death Be Not Proud* presents an argument against the power of death. Critically examine.

3. Answer any one of the following : 5

- (a) Attempt a character sketch of the Chanticleer in *The Nun's Priest's Tale*.
- (b) What is ironic about the fact that Chanticleer believes his dreams are prophetic?
- (c) Write a short note on the characteristics of metaphysical poetry.
- (d) Briefly discuss on the themes, style and structure of Shakespeare's sonnets.

- (a) Is Faustus' damnation tragic or an act of justice? Discuss in detail.

- (c) Write a description of hell as it is variously described and presented in Marlowe's *Doctor Faustus*.

5. Answer any *one* of the following : 5

- (a) Attempt a character sketch of Mephistopheles in *Doctor Faustus*.
- (b) How is the image of the 'fall' used throughout the drama, *Doctor Faustus*?
- (c) Examine the master-servant relationship in Marlowe's *Doctor Faustus*.

6. Answer any *one* of the following : 10

- (a) Analyze the dramatic significance of the sleepwalking scene of Lady Macbeth in Shakespeare's *Macbeth*.
- (b) "Nature has been used by Shakespeare as an indication of the happenings in *Macbeth*." Discuss.
- (c) "Shakespeare has no Heroes but Heroines." Discuss this concept with reference to *Twelfth Night*.
- (d) "The concept of identity and disguise is constantly played out in *Twelfth Night*." Analyze.

7. Answer any *two* of the following : 5×2=10

- (a) Discuss the importance of the porter scene in *Macbeth*.
- (b) Examine the conflict between destiny and free will in *Macbeth*.
